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The Significance of Grandparent's Day

Grandparents Day is celebrated in Goa on July 26. The chosen date, July 26, has a special reason. On this day, the Catholic Church celebrates Saint Joachim and Saint Anne, the parents of Mary and the grandparents of Jesus. The figures of Saint Anne and Saint Joachim represent the fundamental role of grandparents in the structure of a family, regardless of the challenges or joys they share. The presence of grandparents reveals to the younger generation an image of their own future, allowing them to reflect on their actions throughout life.

Grandparents are seen as cultural transmitters, guardians of family history, and links between the past and the future. They play a fundamental role in shaping future society and can offer valuable guidance to achieve social and family perfection.

Grandparents are important in our life because they teach us how to lead a respectful life. They talk to us about their experiences and tell us moral stories, which help us lead peaceful lives.

Grandparents teach us to be punctual and teach us to be respectful to our elders. They show us the right path to follow and help us realise our mistakes.

In many families, grandparents are the primary caregivers if both the parents are working. They are always very proud of their grandchildren and are ever ready to teach them good manners and moral values.

Many children love to be with their grandparents because they can be a source of lovely stories. And grandparents just love their grandchildren to be around them.

We must remember that we always need to be respectful to our grandparents because they are the parents of our parents. Also we need to respect them and help them as they grow older. As they grow older, they get more frail and need our help. We must reach out to them in love remembering all they did for our parents and us when we were small. Make sure you always love your grandparents. Give them a special hug on 26th July!

The Power of the Brown Scapular and Embracing Fátima - 16th July

The devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, particularly through the Brown Scapular, has an inseparable connection with the messages and spirituality of the Fátima apparitions. The concepts of the scapular, the 500-day indulgence, and the Sabbatine Privilege are central to this connection, as are their connections with the themes of prayer, penance, and Marian devotion emphasised in Fátima.

The Brown Scapular and Fátima

The Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel represents devotion to Mary and a commitment to living a life of Christian virtue. This small, simple garment symbolises deep devotion to Mary and her protective intercession. The Brown Scapular's connection to Fátima is most evident during Mary's final apparition on October 13, 1917, when she appeared as Our Lady of Mount Carmel, holding the Scapular. This appearance emphasises the significance of the Scapular in Fátima's messages, particularly its role in fostering devotion and spiritual discipline.

Scapular is a Silent Prayer

As Our Lord taught us to pray the "Our Father", Our Blessed Mother taught us the importance of the scapular. When we use it as a prayer, Our Lady directs us to Her Divine Son's Sacred Heart. It is therefore advisable to hold the scapular in one's hand whilst praying the "Morning Offering", is as perfect as a prayer can get. God's Mother's powerful intercession is especially needed during times of temptation. When the wearer of a scapular confronts temptation while silently praying to the Holy Virgin, the evil spirit is rendered powerless. "If you had recommended yourself to me, you would not have run into such danger," was Our Lady's gentle reproach to Blessed Alan de la Roche, her devoted servant.

Enrollment in the Confraternity

To be eligible for the scapular promise, one must be enrolled in the Brown Scapular Confraternity. This is a simple ceremony which can be performed by any priest. The members of the Confraternity have the added benefit of sharing in all the spiritual benefits of the Carmalite Order.

The Scapular is "Mary's Mantle" should not be pinned or affixed to clothing, and MUST be worn over the shoulders so that one piece falls in front, the other in the back.

The 500-Day Indulgence

Pope Benedict XV, the celebrated World War I Pontiff, granted 500 days indulgence for devoutly kissing your scapular. An indulgence in Catholic theology is the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. This reflects the Church's recognition of the scapular devotion's spiritual benefits. 500 days indulgence does NOT apply to the Medal. To obtain the graces and promise of the Scapular, it must be worn constantly. It should be worn day and night in sickness and in health.

The Sabbatine Privilege

The Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel has promised to save those who wear the scapular from the fires of hell; She will also shorten their stay in purgatory if they should pass from this world still owing some debt of punishment.

This promise is found in a Bulletin of Pope John XXII. The Blessed Virgin appeared to him and, speaking of those who wear the Brown Scapular, said, "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in purgatory I shall free so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting." The Blessed Virgin assigned certain conditions which must be fulfilled:

- Wear the Brown Scapular continuously.
- 2. Observe chastity according to one's state in life (married/single).

Recite daily the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin OR Observe the fasts of the Church together
with abstaining from meat on Wednesdays and Saturdays OR With permission of a priest, say
five decades of Our Lady's Most Holy Rosary OR With permission of a priest, substitute some
other good work.

Marian Devotion and the Message of Fátima


Marian devotion is at the heart of both the Scapular devotion and the Fátima apparitions. At Fátima, Mary introduced herself as the Lady of the Rosary, urging the faithful to pray the Rosary daily for peace and the conversion of sinners. Similarly, the Brown Scapular is a sign of consecration to Mary, symbolising a life dedicated to her service and the imitation of her virtues.

The wearing of the Brown Scapular, coupled with the promises of indulgences and the Sabbatine Privilege, acts as a constant reminder of the need for ongoing prayer, repentance, and dedication to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This devotion encourages the faithful to live in accordance with the messages of Fátima, fostering a spirit of continual conversion and spiritual growth.

- Daily Prayer: Both the Scapular and Fátima call for a commitment to daily prayer, particularly the Rosary.
- **Penance and Reparation**: The indulgences and promises associated with the Scapular encourage acts of penance and reparation, echoing the urgent pleas of Our Lady at Fátima.
- Marian Consecration: Wearing the Scapular signifies a consecration to Mary, aligning with the Fátima call for devotion to her Immaculate Heart.

In summary, the devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel and the Brown Scapular enhances and deepens the spiritual practices encouraged by the Fátima apparitions. Through prayer, penance, and a commitment to Mary, the faithful are guided towards a life of holiness and the ultimate promise of salvation, thus embodying the essence of the Fátima message.
