Editorial

At the end of the last DPC meeting on 21st January 2024, I was invited to attend a meeting at Lar de Estudantes on 17th February 2024 to discuss the Synthesis Report for the ongoing Synod of Synodality. I gladly accepted the invitation because I have been following the ongoing Synod right from the start and I found it to be very interesting. We were asked to come prepared by reading the Synthesis report, which is freely available online (for those interested, the link to download the report is https://www.synod.va/content/dam/synod/assembly/synthesis/english/2023.10.28-ENG-Synthesis-Report.pdf. However, you can just as easily do a Google search for the same and download the PDF to your computer/laptop/smart phone).

The meeting on 17th February was very interesting. The participants were all lay people: some who had served on the DPC earlier, PPC members, catechists, members of associations and professionals. Similar exercises would also be conducted for the clergy, religious and seminarians. There is a brief report in the magazine.

When I was about to leave, Fr. Leo Fernandes, Executive Secretary, Diocesan Pastoral Secretariat, invited me to attend another meeting on 9th March 2024. Once again, I gladly accepted. Then, a few days after that, Fr. Leo called me again asking if I could also participate in a full day program at St. Joseph Vaz Retreat Centre, Old Goa on 26th February 2024! The answer, of course, was, "Yes"!

The session on 26th February was titled **CCBI Strategic Planning Diocesan Level Workshop**. We were to meet and come up with at least 3 strategic goals to focus on for the various Commissions of the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI): goals that they can work towards achieving by 2033. The participants included the Vicar General, Deans, Priests, religious, lay people and youth. The workshop was very interesting and productive with active participation from all the participants. A brief report appears somewhere in the magazine.

On 18th February, 21 parishioners from Ucassaim participated in the 6th Walking Pilgrimage. This year, the North Goa parishes had to start from the Bambolim Cross. The journey was the same for all 21 of us, but it was interesting to see how some of our participants saw the walk from their perspective. We present some views in this issue.

The Formation Sessions for the Reconstitution of the Parish Pastoral Council are on. We had our second session on 25th February evening from 5pm onwards. Though attendance was a bit thin and disappointing this time, the session itself was very interesting and full of practical advice for the prospective PPC members. What was interesting was that the Secretaries for the three groups that took part in the Group Discussion were all from the Youth - a very promising sign, showing that our Youth are ready to take a more active part in Parish affairs!

Meanwhile, preparations are on and people are eagerly waiting for the Counselling and Retreat on 2nd and 3rd March as part of the Lenten programme. Last year the Church was packed on both days. We look forward to a good turnout as well.

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Diocesan Level Workshop for CCBI Strategic Planning

I was invited to attend a full-day workshop that was to come up with strategic plans for the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI). The workshop was held on 26th February 2024 from 9.00am to 4.00pm at the St. Joseph Vaz Retreat Centre, Old Goa.

The day started with registrations. In all, 32 participants were invited to attend this workshop and all of them were present. The participants included the Vicar General, Fr. Jose Remedios Fernandes, Deans, Priests, Nuns, and some lay people and youth.

After a short prayer service, His Eminence Filipe Neri Cardinal Ferrao was there for the inaugural session. His Eminence gave us the background for the workshop, which was very informative and interesting.

Then there was the lighting of the lamp followed by a small felicitation. His Eminence was felicitated for having being elected President of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC). The two resource persons for the workshop, Mrs. Maria D'Mello and Fr. Leo Fernandes, Executive Secretary, Diocesan Pastoral Secretariat, Goa were also felicitated, as was the Vicar General of the Archdiocese, Fr. Jose Remedios Fernandes.

This was followed by a group photograph after which His Eminence had to leave for other engagements. The participants proceeded for tea with a promise that they would come back with renewed vigour to tackle the process of strategic planning.

After tea, the core business of the workshop started with the resource persons explaining what was expected of us and the methodology that was to be followed. The methodology was called Spiritual Conversations and followed a pattern similar to what was followed at the first session of the Synod of Synodality in Rome.

The CCBI has 8 Commissions, like the Commission for Women, Commission for Laity, Commission for Liturgy and so on. All the participants were divided into 4 groups named Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Each group was given the task of discussing and coming up with three goal/objectives for two Commissions of the CCBI that were allotted to them. Each group had to come up with three objectives and key performance indicators (KPIs) that the CCBI Commissions will work towards for the next 10 years, till 2033.

The methodology was just awesome. Each group was seated around a round table. A Moderator and Secretary were allotted for each group. The moderator led the group in a small prayer asking the Holy Spirit to enlighten the participants so that they could put forward their

views on what were the priorities for the Commissions allotted to them.

Taking the first Commission, each person in the group then had to present his/her views on the subject - the listening round. For example, we had to find three focus areas for the Laity. Each member presented his/her views on what we need to focus on regarding the Laity. The others just listened. Then followed a time of silent prayer asking the Holy Spirit for guidance. In the following round each person in the group just talked about what he/she appreciated about the views expressed by others in the listening round. After each person in a group had spoken, there followed another round of silent prayer. Then the Secretary announced the points of agreement and the Moderator guided the participants as they tried to identify three focus areas. This allowed for some discussion as the participants tried to iron out three priorities based on the listening and appreciation rounds. Here they could also add any additional points if they wanted to. By this time, generally, a broad consensus was reached and the three focal points were honed and refined. Then a short time of silence and gratitude followed. The exercise was repeated for the second Commission allotted to each group.

This exercise took us to about 1pm and it was time for a sumptuous buffet. The participants were seen talking and discussing the proceedings while enjoying the meal. While the participants were enjoying their lunch, the Moderators and Secretaries, as well as the resource persons, were tweaking and fine-tuning the results of the discussions.

Post-lunch we had the Plenary Session where the Secretaries presented the three focus objectives of their group for each Commission. After each presentation, the members of the other groups could add additional focus areas or modify the focus areas presented.

The methodology followed at the workshop was extremely effective in keeping each participant focused. It was also effective in allowing each group member to present his/her views. This led to us arriving at a consensus in a very calm and dignified way with no raised voices or unnecessary arguments, in an atmosphere of listening and discerning.

All that remained after this whole exercise was to thank the organisers and the participants for a lovely experience where each felt that they had contributed in some way towards the strategic goals of the Latin rite Catholic Church in Goa. Of course, the same exercise will undoubtedly be conducted in each diocese in India. This will lead to the creation of a document that will guide the working of the CCBI till 2033.

Just so blessed and privileged to be a part of this process! And I did walk away having met so many lovely people. Praise God for that! (Group Photo on Inside Back Cover)

The Walking Pilgrimage - Perspectives

The 6th Walking Pilgrimage was held on 18th February 2024, the first Sunday of Lent. Twenty-one parishioners from Ucassaim decided to participate this time around. Twenty-one participants walked the same route, but each one had a different perspective and take on the journey. Here we present perspectives from some of our parishioners.

Vijay Kerketta (Igorj Vaddo)

I feel urged to share the experience of our first Walking Pilgrimage from Bambolim Cross to Sancole.

To begin with, the bus taking us from Church to Bambolim was bang on time and so were the pilgrims: NOBODY was late. We left the Church compound at 02:30 hrs on the DOT and were led in prayer by a group member. After we reached the Bambolim cross we were met there by a Priest who guided us about how to go and saw us off.

From there we began the walk with great Zeal and vigour and mind you,.....it was the Ladies who were in the forefront. As we walked, my wife was not able to keep pace with the group due her health and her physical conditions. So as my wife and I started lagging, some members fell back along with us, kept us company and started praying the Rosary. Slowly, Marietta and her husband Peter also fell back to keep us company and pray the Rosary together. I could see so many volunteers en route and they were ever willing to help. So not once, but many times I urged our companions to leave us behind, and to join the group but they would not and none of them would agree with me and NEVER EVER did they leave my wife and me alone. They kept on encouraging us to carry on and not to give up the walk.

While the reciting of the Rosary was happening among us from time to time, these are the words that kept ringing in my mind 'I WILL BE WITH YOU TILL THE END OF TIME', because of the love and the genuine concern that was being showered upon us. While the group walked ahead after covering around half the distance, the five of us stopped for a water break. And it was here that my wife felt very exhausted, and that she might not be able to walk any further. No sooner we got to know it we got in touch with the volunteers and arranged for a pick-up vehicle. Marietta accompanied my wife to the Doctors who were available on the way. My wife was diagnosed as being dehydrated; after quick first aid, she was good to go and the pick-up vehicle dropped her and Marietta to the venue.

Trevor. Peter and I reached the venue on foot.

At the venue we saw volunteers all around guiding and helping the pilgrims so as to avoid any chaos and confusion. And never was there any chaos or confusion, thanks to the brilliant work of the volunteers and the TRUE CHRISTIAN VALUES.....felt proud to be CATHOLIC and delighted to witness such orderly conduct. There were buns and tea for all while entering the venue and also while exiting the venue. Hats off to the selfless and dedicated efforts of the volunteers without whom such a mammoth gathering would have not been possible.

We attended mass which was concelebrated by the His Eminence Filipe Neri Cardinal Ferrao and priests. Devotional singing by the choir. Excellent seating and viewing arrangements.

After the Mass we were able to locate each other without much difficulty and then proceed to where our bus was waiting for us

Once we got on the bus Marietta and another lady in the group, took out some buns, applied a very tasty chutney and started serving them to all he members of the group. And that is not all! After this quick snack as we got started Trevor lead the group in a thanksgiving prayer. We had a wonderful journey back home and reached the church

compound to meet the community who has just attended the Sunday Mass.

After the lovely Mass, His Eminence Filipe Neri Cardinal Ferrao also offered the petitions of the faithful up to God as the petitions, written by the faithful on paper provided by the volunteers were set alight...an awesome sight!

Dumpem

We then discussed our Ward Mass and cleaning of the Church by the next 4 houses. We also discussed about the Friday Way of the Cross as it has to be conducted by our Ward. We decided to have a Way of the Cross from house to house. We will start at 4.30pm on 5th March 2024.

Punola

The Punola Somudai was held on 9th February in the Holy Cross Chapel. We had 5 members present.

We started with a small prayer. Then we discussed the matters that came up at the PPC meeting. The members present felt that we could contribute towards Parish expenses, but they preferred that the contributions be kept with the Ward and only be released as and when required.

Then we had a small introductory session on Lectio Divina or Divine Reading. We took the Gospel reading for the day and went through the steps of Lectio Divina: Lectio (Read), Meditatio (Meditate on the Word), Oratio (Pray on what the Word means to you), Contemplatio (Contemplate on what God is telling you through the Word) and Actio (How are you going to adopt what God is telling you through the Word).

Consultation on the Synod Synthesis Report

The Synod of Synodality had their first meeting in October 2023. The outcome of this meeting was a Synthesis Report - A Synodal Church in Mission. This report has been widely distributed and is available for download by anybody. The Report itself is a 42-page document divided into 20 chapters. Each chapter has three sections: Convergences, Matters for Consideration and Proposals.

Convergences were obviously the points on which a majority of the Synod participants agreed upon as important. Matters for Consideration were points where there were differences, but they were significantly important. Proposals were points that were proposed but need to be discussed more,

The next step in the Synodal process is a discussion on the Synthesis Report all over the world. These discussions and consultations involve studying the report and providing focus areas for discussion at the next Synod meeting in October 2024.

Keeping this in mind, the Archdiocese of Goa and Daman is conducting various consultations all over the Archdiocese. Separate consultations are being held for priests, religious, seminarians and lay people.

One such consultation was held at Lar de Estudantes on 17th February 2024. This meeting was for lay people. Those invited were ex-DPC members, DPC members, DePC members, catechists, members of Associations and professionals.

The meeting was to start at 3.30pm, but, due to a mis-communication, we ultimately started at 4pm. Fr. Leo Fernandes, Executive Secretary, Diocesan Pastoral Secretariat informed us about what we were required to do - basically select three focus areas for our Archdiocese in different areas. At the meeting on the 17th our discussions were limited to the first eight chapters of the Report.

The methodology was explained to us by Ms. Gayle Misquita, an ex-DPC member. Eight facilitators were selected. The remaining participants were then put into these eight groups and the discussions started.

Our group was asked to discuss only the Proposals from Chapters 1-8. In the group, in pairs, we were to discuss and select three focus areas, from the Proposals in chapters 1-8. The various groups started work in earnest and quickly jotted down the gist of their discussions while enjoying lovely tea and snacks.

The exercise made us feel we were part of the Synodal process, no matter how insignificant our contribution, and that our opinions and choices mattered.

I was invited because I am the Moderator of the Mapusa Deanery Pastoral Council. If I could be elected as Moderator of the PPC and DePC, I am sure we have more capable people in our Parish who can do things much better. Therefore, I encourage you to participate wholeheartedly in building Christ's kingdom by willingly coming forward when called upon by the Church. Then you too can play a part, however insignificant, in the decision-making process of the Catholic Church.
